HegartyMaths

We are delighted to tell you about a new maths homework system we have recently put in place to support your child. HegartyMaths is an amazing website which gives video support for every question students attempt, to make sure that homework can be completed independently. It also comes with revision features to support students in doing independent revision, we hope that this program will support students in improving their mathematical skills.

Hegarty Maths Homework

Hegarty Maths Homework will be set every Friday by the maths department for all year groups, it will be due in by the following Friday. As questions are targeted to support students' ability they need to achieve a minimum mark of 70% to demonstrate satisfactory effort. If their mark is less than 70% they will need to do the quiz again. The questions will change but remain similar. This will give them repetition, which helps develop their memory and recall.

Students will be supplied with a workbook in which they will be required to show their working. Students must bring their work book in with them every Friday to show their teachers their workings to the solutions they have entered online. As within the Maths GCSE qualification, more marks are provided for working, than getting the correct answer it is essential that teachers are able to see this skill developing in the workbooks over time. It also allows teaching staff to swiftly pick up on any misconceptions.

Logging in

Logging in is really easy - simply choose the school name (The Harefield Academy), then use their name and date of birth to log in. If your child is struggling to log in or have forgotten their password, please just click on the forgotten password link on the login page, their maths teachers will be notified and reset their passwords accordingly.

How can I see what they are doing?

We would like to encourage you to log in with your child to see what they are doing. You can watch the videos with them to see what methods they should be using, and you can also view all of their past scores to see which areas they are struggling with.
